Secretary of State Jim Condos to Speak at Voting Rights Panel, Washington, DC

Washington, DC – On Tuesday, February 10th, Vermont Secretary of State Jim Condos will join a panel to speak on voting rights in America.

“Preserving our voting rights is the most fundamental act we must take to maintaining our democracy. Over the centuries, history has seen protections to this right increase. However, in recent times, some states have sought new restrictions. It is crucial that we discuss these policies openly and frankly and we examine the reality that any restriction on voter eligibility is a restriction on a right protected under the constitution,” Condos remarked.

“The real voter fraud is to deny any eligible American their constitutional right to cast a ballot. I look forward to discussing these issues with colleagues in DC and bringing Vermont’s election experience to the table,” Condos added.

The panel is hosted by GMMB and Lawyers’ Committee for Civil Rights Under Law. Other panelists include: Barbara Arnwine, President and Executive Director of the Lawyers’ Committee for Civil Rights Under Law, Danielle Holley-Walker, Dean of Howard University School of Law, and Debo Adegbile, Partner at WilmerHale and former Acting President and Director-Counsel of the NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund.
